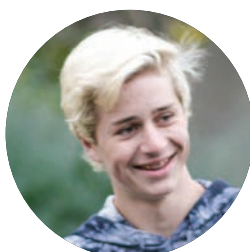

ALPINE



There is no doubt that alpine ski racing is a rigorous sport - the weather, the snow surfaces, the travel, and the difficulty of achieving one solid result. A DNF (Did Not Finish) on the scoreboard is more common in alpine than most other sports. It happens to multiple athletes at every single race. But, behind every DNF there is always a story and an individual journey. SVSEF athletes learn to see beyond the result, especially if there are letters next to their name instead of a time. We use results to inspire and motivate us, but we never let them define who we are or where we are going. In many ways, the 2019-2020 season ended with a DNF. But similar to what we teach our athletes, we are not focusing on the end result, we're thinking about the skills we acquired last season and how they are furthering each athlete's journey.

As a staff we started the season with the collective mindset of focusing on the necessary foundational steps to achieve long-term success. We built season-long progressions for every age group and each athlete's growth was exceptional. As for results, our athletes experienced great success, but as always, there was no shortage of DNF's. Prior to the mountain shutting down on March 15, we had current and past athletes qualify for championship events at all levels and stand on numerous podiums, from Jack Smith qualifying for World Juniors and Jessica Blackburn qualifying for Alpe Cambre to almost forty U10 and U12 athletes qualifying for the Intermountain Division Championships. We even saw Alpine X athletes sweep the podium at their first skiercross event!

Despite only a handful of athletes getting the chance to compete at championship events this year, we saw big strides elsewhere - in training, at video sessions, at inter-team races. In a way, we all walked away from last season with a DNF next to our names, but the 2019-2020 season is just one part of the story. The joy of winning is unlike any other feeling but focusing on our long-term journey is just as important. This season will definitely look very different, but I have no doubt that the athletes, staff and community that make up this program will come together and put in the work to make it a success!

BALDY DEVO + LASAR

Despite a shortened winter, our SVSEF Development Teams had an incredible season. Our Devo program this past year was fully subscribed in both numbers and enthusiasm. Our philosophy with the Devo program is to transform the life of a child through positivity and fundamental teaching. Beyond teaching ski and snowboard skills, we emphasize mountain etiquette, nutrition, how to be a good teammate and an appreciation for the mountains.

LASAR (Learn to Alpine Ski and Race)

Based out of Rotarun (our little hill with a big heart), this team makes ski racing fun! Athletes focused on stance and balance while skiing duals, adventure courses and freeskiing. Baldy Devo continues to grow, not just in size but also in fine tuning how and what we teach. With our seasoned staff and the use of handbooks to set team guidelines, we inspire a mountain kid sense of identity. Baldy Devo learns to ski the whole mountain, from moguls to terrain parks to groomers. It is amazing to see every athlete's transformation throughout the season. Both athletes and coaches are always striving to improve and find their best selves on the slopes and in the mountains

Both the National and Mountain X teams focused on continuing to gain an understanding of IFSA competition rules and creativity in their skiing. This came in the form of working on line choice for competitions or developing their own personal style whether in the Air Barn* or on snow.

With that focus, the Big Mountain team had some outstanding competition results this winter. Ethan Marx led the season long IFSA Intermountain standings for SVSEF, with a second place standing overall for the 2019/2020 season. Ten additional SVSEF athletes finished in the top 20 in their respective age groups and disciplines for IFSA Intermountain.

Beyond competition results backcountry travel and avalanche awareness were emphasized throughout the season. It proved to be effective and highly rewarding for athletes to complete their Avalanche 1 and Companion Rescue courses. The future of this sport and this program is deeply rooted in building experience in backcountry terrain!

An impressive component of the team this year was the pure joy our athletes had for every single day they had on snow. Even when the tide was low or the season cut short, our team kept smiling and loving every minute they spent with their skis and snowboards on their feet.

Well what do we say about the 2019-2020 snowboard season? What do we focus on? What will be remembered and how will we choose to move forward from all it handed us?

For me the 2020 season is one of optimism for snowboarding in the Wood River Valley. I want to focus on the growth at our entry levels. The SVSEF Rota-Rippers learn to ride program at Rotarun grew from 6 riders in 2018/2019 to almost 20 kids this past season. SVSEF Snowboarding's Development program on Baldy exceeded our cap limit and is poised to begin moving kids through our pipeline to our Mini Shred program for 2021. This growth has allowed us to begin hiring a new wave of young coaches (many of whom are alumni) which will only increase the energy and stoke that SVSEF Snowboarding is committed to creating for our riders.

As for the upper level travel athletes, yes, our season got cut short as far as end of the year events went. That being said, our regional season had wrapped up and it was clear where our riders stacked up within our region and nationally. A common theme emerged with all travelling riders finishing in the top 3rd of their age groups nationally and earning invites to USASA Nationals.

Here is my hope moving forward. During the winter, we start with the best of intentions to focus on the training and progression. Travel begins and schedules change. All of us riders, coaches and parents get pulled in a million different directions. What do we want from it? How do we get there? I feel like those types of questions help shape the kind of riders we want to be and what this sport can be for us and trust me it is very different for everyone!

Snowboarding can and should be a vehicle for finding out who you are, what you're made of and seeing where it can take you. The options are limitless!

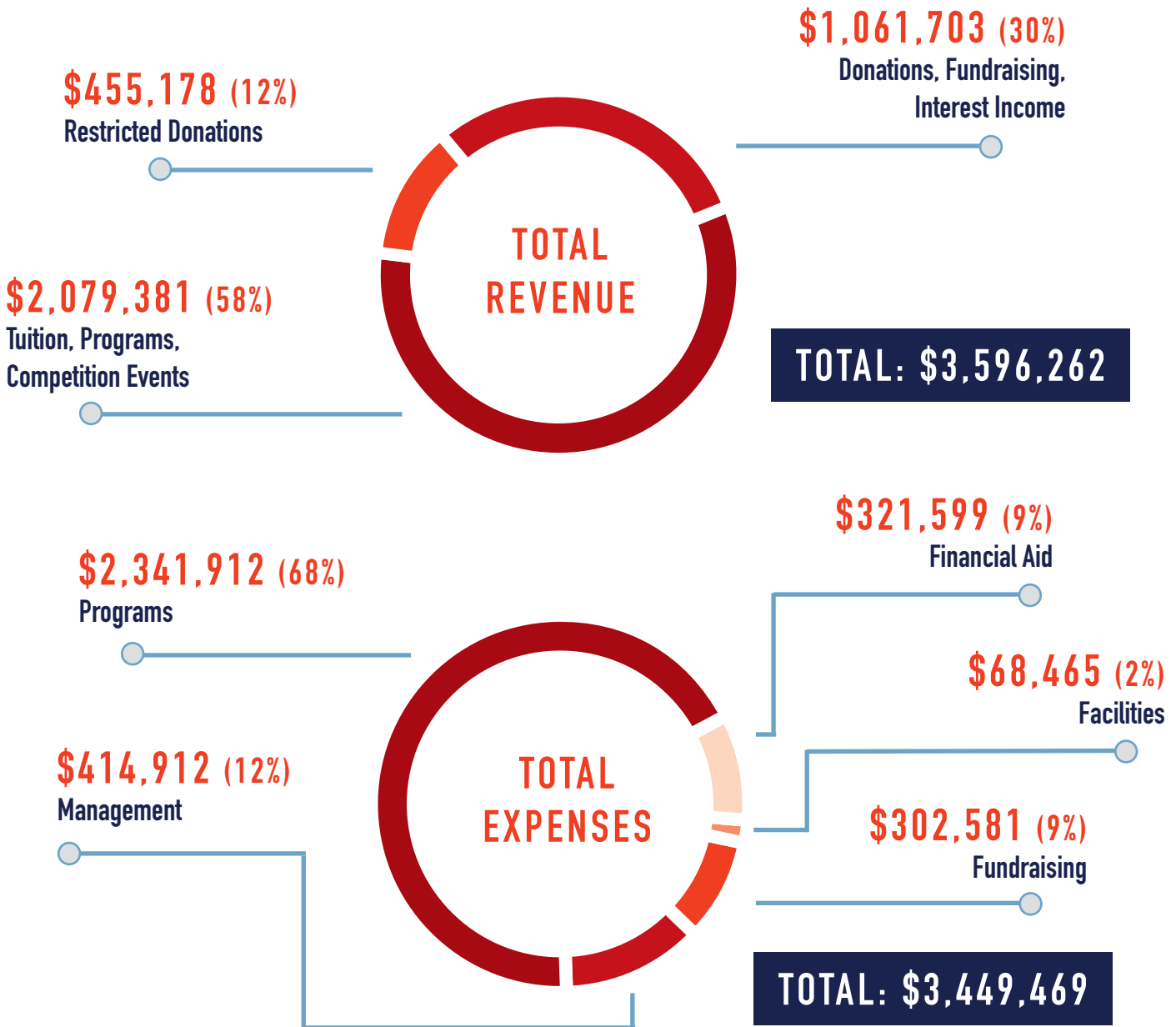
