





OUR FUTURE (TO THE GRAND STAGE)

Our future is bright. We are proud to be represented by nine SVSEF-trained athletes on U.S. National Teams in 2015-16. SVSEF's Gold Team, designed to support elite athletes in their quest for international supremacy, has 13 members. SVSEF's tradition of excellence was recognized in 2015 as our Olympic/Paralympic Training Site designation was expanded to include all five snowsport disciplines. We are the only site in the country to hold this honor. In 2015-16, SVSEF will host the U.S. Junior Freestyle Championships, and Sun Valley will be the site of the U.S. Alpine Championships, giving our athletes the benefit of watching and competing against the nation's best.

PROGRAMS IN REVIEW

ALPINE TEAM - Scott McGrew

Despite challenging conditions across the Western United States, the SVSEF alpine team had an incredible 2014-15 season. We saw significant success up and down the alpine ranks as we logged north of 40 race victories across all age classes. We hosted a large team (165 alpine-specific athletes) with a new influx of older athletes, as well as new athletes at the younger level who were attracted to the team, the challenge, and the community. Through the diligent work of our core coaching staff we made a tremendous effort to create better and innovative frameworks to support planning our lessons, and sharpening our objectives on daily, weekly and yearly levels.

There is simply nothing more incredible than a child who experientially understands the laws of physics and motion; who can control his or her body to a point of grace, power, and efficiency on skis. The positive implications of having the confidence and ability to achieve proficiency on skis are far reaching, well beyond the world of sport, mountains, and snow. Year after year we send our athletes into the world to pursue their dreams and aspirations beyond SVSEF. In the 2014-15 season we were very proud to have nine graduating seniors from the alpine team, all of whom are either pursuing elite competition further, or attending excellent colleges across the country. These fine young men and women are well prepared to be future leaders, innovators, risk takers, and impact players in their chosen communities. The larger lessons learned while training and competing as SVSEF athletes will, without doubt, empower our graduates with the fortitude and tenacity to achieve their dreams. Godspeed kiddos!

In addition to the work done with our athletes, we were able to host a number of exceptionally high-quality events, culminating in the 2015 Western Region Elite Spring Series. The amount of coordination, volunteer hours, vision, and planning put into these events is incredible. The return on our efforts is tremendous as we were able to give back to our families, local businesses, and community through the associated athletic and economic opportunities that came with having these events here in Sun Valley. We are looking forward to the 2015-16 U.S. National Alpine Championships on Bald Mountain next March.

Finally, I would like to thank the coaches, the families, the SVSEF Board of Directors, and the community for their continued support of our program and vision. This past season was defined by commitment and resolve, by triumph and challenge, by innovation and work. The competition results may be in the books, but the real excitement lies in the promise of the future. The work we do in this community would not be possible without all of you.

SNOWBOARD TEAM - Andy Ware

The Snowboard Team saw many new faces this past season. Riding the momentum of Kaitlyn Farrington's gold medal from the 2014 Olympics, the snowboard team grew to its biggest size in four years with nine new riders joining the Devo Team. Summer and fall training sessions at the Air Barn proved to be working as many athletes were gaining confidence to attempt new tricks and others were mastering bold moves and raising the bar for everyone around them.

Our Comp Travel Team welcomed new head coach Nate Farrell to the program. Nate's own 10-year pro snowboarding career provided tons of competition experience to share with athletes but it was his charismatic, genuine and sincere approach toward all the athletes that earned him their trust and helped them to push for goals they had not attempted before. Nate was surrounded by an incredible encore cast of coaches, from the Development Team to the Travel Team, who continue



to keep the stoke for snowboarding high among the team members and develop some of the best riders in the country.

Snowboard Gold Team member Chase Josey began his first season on the U.S. Snowboard Pro Team with a bang. Chase finished fifth in the first Grand Prix of the year and then followed up with tenth at the Dew Tour after qualifying first. Chase made the finals in nearly every Grand Prix all season and capped his season off by winning the Red Bull Double Pipe event at Aspen Colorado in March! Needless to say Chase was renamed to the U.S. Snowboard Pro Team again for 2016 and is looking to keep pushing the limits in the years to come.

Here in Sun Valley our Snowboard Team athletes were excelling at contests week after week. Eleven athletes qualified for the USASA Snowboard National Championships with Payton Bacca taking home a bronze medal in halfpipe (U15) and a fifth in boarder cross. Payton's results earned her an invite to the elite USSA Snowboard Project Gold camp this past spring. Ten year-old Jack Verhaeghe made a huge impression at USASA Nationals, finishing in the top 10 in four different events and fourth overall in the combined category. All season long SVSEF Snowboard Team athletes were taking on new challenges, facing fears, gaining confidence and building friendships.

This Snowboard Team is a tight group that looks out for each other on and off the hill. The caring qualities are passed on by the parents and the coaches down to their kids. We are so grateful to be a part of the SVSEF family and have the opportunities to pursue our passion for riding all season long. To the athletes, coaches and parents in the snowboard program, I want to say THANK YOU for all of the hard work and amazing effort put forth by everyone. And THANK YOU to all the supporters of SVSEF for making this program possible.

FREESTYLE/FREESKIING TEAMS - Andy Ware

The Freestyle and Freeskiing program got an early start to the 2015 season. Summer training began with weekly workout sessions in the Air Barn. Teams were on snow in July and August at Mt. Hood, Oregon. We are always looking for ways to provide the best training experiences possible for our athletes and last summer we took aerial training to a whole new level. With the help of former U.S. Freestyle aerialist team member Dave Valenti, we were able to set up a jump big enough for athletes to train inverted aerial maneuvers with their skis on and land safely in water right here in Sun Valley. It was an exciting summer that set the tone for what was to come in the winter.

Our team numbers swelled again and as a result we were able to add Freestyle Team alumni Cord Roth and Collin Collins to our coaching staff. We brought back Mike Smit, who coached for the program 20 years ago, and former freestyle coach Jeff Page. The growth and success of our program is a direct result of our outstanding coaching staff sharing their passion for skiing with our athletes and their focus on building solid relationships.

Once again, the Sun Valley Freestyle and Freeskiing Spectacular event proved to be the highlight of competitions for many, many athletes. We were host to seven different freestyle clubs from three different divisions with over 275 competitors. The weather was outstanding, the mogul course held up and the parent volunteer support was monumental. The level of competition from all of the athletes was truly spectacular. Sun Valley Company helped to make quality freestyle venues which allowed competitors to go all out holding nothing back and giving their best effort run after run.

SVSEF Gold Team and U.S. Freeskiing Team members Wing Tai Barrymore and Jacob Beebe both had solid seasons with top 10 results in pro-level events and finished the season in the top 25 in world rankings.

The 2014-15 season went by quickly. There were so many accomplishments by so many athletes it was incredible to witness their growth in the sport and as citizens of our community. We have such strong relationships with everyone in our program that we all experience the successes and frustrations of every season together. I am grateful for the vision of SVSEF Board of Directors, the leadership of Rob Clayton, our partnership with Sun Valley Company and the support of everyone in the SVSEF community. Thank you for allowing me to continue to be a part of this incredible program.

CROSS COUNTRY TEAM - Rick Kapala

Cross Country ski racing—even on a good day—is a pretty big challenge. Lung-blowing uphill, high-speed risky downs on skinny edgeless skis and miles and miles of punishing terrain require our skiers to push themselves into a mental and physical space that is well beyond what most athletes are willing to endure. Witnessing this effort is inspiring to all of us who coach these amazing young athletes of the SVSEF Nordic Team. Our program has always tried to create a team environment where kids combine a love of outdoor athletics and adventure with the personal quest associated with endurance sport. We reinforce the value of commitment to a process and try to keep results in perspective; to that end we empower team members to push far beyond what they thought was possible. At least that's the plan!

Our U14 and older skiers posted many personal bests and podiums. In addition to the efforts of the older skiers, we have had an especially solid year in our youth teams. Prep Team head coach Kelley Sinnott led the largest-ever prep team through a year that was full of training, learning about ski racing and building a

great team chemistry. Head Devo Coach Dave Bingham, also shepherded the SVSEF XC Devo Teams to another promising season. Devo skiers spend a lot of time developing their love of winter sport through many creative practices dreamed up by Dave and his coaches. SVSEF Cross Country Gold Team, led by Gold Team head coach Colin Rodgers, charged through a year of training and racing on the national and international stage. Gold Team skier Matt Gelso qualified for the US Team to World Champs and he was joined on the international stage by our Paige Schember who qualified World U23 Champs for her first-ever international selection. Gold teamer Mary Rose posted her first-ever National Super Tour win along with Super Tour Podium SVSEF skiers Miles Havlick and Ben Lustgarten. The value of having a Gold Team as part of our SVSEF program is immeasurable as Gold Team athletes set the highest of bars for our younger skiers to emulate.

The Cross Country Team has enjoyed a very long run of success in large part due to the efforts of the athletes themselves, the coaches, the parents and SVSEF as a whole. We are fortunate to have such a vibrant ski culture within our community and the Sun Valley Ski Education Foundation provides a platform for all of our skiers as they strive to reach their own personal goals in skiing.

ALL MOUNTAIN DEVO - Jennifer Diehl

The SVSEF Devo Program kicked off the 2014-2015 season as one combined Devo Team. With a total of 121 athletes. The total local Devo ski days were 1,981!

The curriculum for our Devo program included skill-development progressions from both alpine and freestyle branches, along with expertise and coaching talent from both disciplines. The alpine and freestyle staff worked together to create the absolute best experience possible for this age group (7 to 10 years old). With this collective spectrum of experience on skis, we



provided our Devo Team with the confidence and skills necessary to drive their abilities further, regardless of which discipline they ultimately may pursue.

We began the season with dryland training in November at the Air Barn and Sagewillow fields. Dryland sessions were a combination of outdoor cardio and indoor trampoline along with strength, balance and agility.

In early December, we did evaluations with all new athletes on Lower River Run. Kids new to the program had the chance to meet their coaches and teammates on snow and ski with us before ski team started. This helped our coaching staff organize groups according to ability before our training began.

Due to limited terrain in early December, ski training began on December 13th. We trained on Saturdays and Sundays, 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. all winter long. We also offered eight days of training over the holidays. In addition, we provided coaches during the school ski days at Hemingway and Hailey Elementary and we provided sessions during school closures. During Spring Break, our older Devo kids trained with the Alpine Mini-World Cup and Freestyle Prep Teams, and we held "tryouts" for kids interested in joining Devo next season.

During the course of the season, basic skiing techniques, introduction to giant slalom, slalom training, mogul progression and park and pipe progression were all part of our training. Devo athletes participated in several NASTAR races, the Kindercup, Hobson Memorial and Future Freestyler's Mogul Event. Every training day we presented the kids with skills training and drills, working on edging on the groomers as well as forward stance and balance in the powder. We also trained several days at Dollar, working on park and pipe progression. But overall, we provided a strong, all-mountain skiing foundation and inspired a passion for skiing. Evaluations were done on all kids at the end of the

season. This information was dispersed to parents and to the next levels of SVSEF Alpine and Freestyle programs. Parents were surveyed at the end of the season about how we did and we received very positive feedback regarding overall experience, well-balanced training, efficient drop off and pick up, effective communication and excellent coaching staff.

GOLD TEAM

Since 2005, SVSEF Gold Teams have supported the unique coaching and financial needs of elite skiers and riders in pursuit of their Olympic dreams. Gold Team athletes give back the support they receive many times over. Their motivation, determination, grit and greatness has a trickle-down effect, inspiring everyone from our youngest to oldest athletes to realize their full potential.

SVSEF's designation as an Olympic and Paralympic Training Site (OPTS) in 2015 dramatically expanded the potential future impact of our organization. Now more than ever before, we are uniquely positioned to improve training facilities across all of our snowsport disciplines and strengthen the support offered to elite athletes. Our youth is our future. By supporting SVSEF through our endowment, general fundraising, or Gold Program, you are not only investing in the local community but in the entire U.S. Olympic movement.



SVSEF ACADEMICS

As a SVSEF alumnus, I can understand the difficulty of juggling both skiing and academic commitments. There is no way to avoid the conflicting schedules of winter ski racing with a typical academic calendar. The Academic Program within SVSEF was created to help athletes and their families understand and manage the extreme time demands made on competitive winter athletes.

As the Academic Director of SVSEF, I work with the public and private school systems in the Wood River Valley to develop academic programs that work with SVSEF-specific training and travel schedules. In addition, I communicate regularly with teachers while monitoring and supporting the athletes who need additional academic help.

2014-2015 was the second full season with the Academic Center located in the Engl Training Center at Warm Springs. This greatly facilitated communication with the program directors and athletes who sought academic assistance.

Some of the “academic” highlights of the 2014-2015 season include the development of an alpine “early morning” training program at Wood River Middle School (WRMS); increased communication and academic monitoring with WRMS; a great “Life After SVSEF” roundtable with SVSEF alums over the holiday season; yet another stellar academic year by SVSEF high-school athletes. **The average GPA of all SVSEF high-school athletes was an impressive 3.48!**

Of the 19 graduating seniors, all are continuing on to college OR taking a post-grad year to pursue their goals in ski racing. Of the 17 athletes attending school in 2015-2016, nearly 60 percent received some level of merit-based scholarship. More than half plan to continue skiing/boarding at some level next season. I believe these numbers speak to the talent and dedication of SVSEF seniors.

I want to remind everyone that the SVSEF Academic Program is a **monitoring and SUPPORT network for all athletes**. Whether students are struggling to stay afloat during the busy traveling season or simply need help moving from a “B” to an “A,” we are here to help.



2014-15 HIGHLIGHTS

The Sun Valley Ski Education Foundation welcomed a record number of athletes last year (532), the most ever in our 49-year history. For the 2014/15 season we had 266 athletes in the alpine program, 151 in cross country, 85 in freestyle and 30 in snowboard. The previous high mark was 512 in 2007.

GOLD TEAM

Seven SVSEF athletes (all Gold Team members) qualified for World Championships, including **Hailey Duke**, **Will Brandenburg**, **Matt Gelso**, **Paige Schember**, **Tai Barrymore**, **Jacob Beebe** and **Chase Josey**.

At the conclusion of USSA Congress meetings in Park City, Utah, several SVSEF athletes were nominated to the U.S. Ski and Snowboard Team. **Kipling Weisel** was promoted from the Alpine D Team to the C. **Tanner Farrow** was nominated to the newly-created National University Team. **Chase Josey** remains on the U.S. Snowboard Pro Halfpipe Team. **Wing Tai Barrymore** (Pro) and **Jacob Beebe** (Rookie) were named to Freeskiing Halfpipe squads. Former SVSEF competitor **Sophia Schwartz** is on the U.S. Freestyle C Team. **Simi Hamilton** (A) and **Noah Hoffman** (B), also with ties to SVSEF, were nominated to the U.S. Cross Country Team.

National Training Group invitations were issued to alpine skiers **Austin Savaria**, **Will Snyder** and **Lily Fitzgerald**, and cross country skier **Ben Lustgarten**.

SVSEF Gold Team snowboarder **Chase Josey** won the 2015 Red Bull Double Pipe Challenge at Aspen, Colorado. Here at home, Josey stomped the field in the Baldy Banked Slalom, winning by almost two seconds. Josey qualified for the men's snowboard halfpipe at the FIS Freestyle Ski & Snowboard World Championships.

Olympic Champion Kaitlyn Farrington retired from competitive snowboarding due to a degenerative neck



condition. She remains an active snowboarder and ambassador of the sport. The Wood River Valley native was named "Athlete of the Year" by the Idaho Mountain Express.



Valley native **Hailey Duke** retired from competitive ski racing at the conclusion of the Western Region Spring Series in Sun Valley. In the series, Duke skied to second and fourth in slalom – her specialty. At the U.S. National Championships, Duke was fourth in the slalom. Duke will attend Westminster College in Utah this fall majoring in marketing.

In his first year on the U.S. Ski Team, **Kipling Weisel** recorded five second-place finishes in FIS racing and 17 top-10s with a seventh in the U.S. National Championship men's downhill.

Tanner Farrow stood on the podium three times in FIS races this season, garnering first place in a FIS super G at Mt. Bachelor. He had 12 top-10 placements (four fourths) with a tenth in the U.S. National Championship men's downhill.

Cross Country Gold Team members recorded seven top-10 finishes at U.S. Senior Nationals with **Miles Havlick** claiming three top-10 placements. **Matt Gelso** and **Mary Rose** collected two apiece. At the conclusion of Senior Nationals, **Paige Schember**, **Rose**, **Havlick** and **Gelso** qualified for OPA Cup Races in Europe. Havlick finished the OPA Cup Finals as the top American male.

Gelso was nominated to the U.S. World Championship team in Falun, Sweden, and comprised half the top American duo in World Cup sprints at Otepää, Estonia, finishing 11th overall in freestyle sprints. He stepped up on the podium four times in Super Tour racing, including winning a 15k freestyle at West Yellowstone.

Havlick set a new mark in the Baldy Hill Climb, completing the 1.86 mile 3,140 vertical race in 35:04,

breaking Michael Tobin's 25-year-old record by seven seconds.

In the U23 World Championships in Almaty, Kazakhstan, SVSEF's **Schember** was 38th in the 10k skate and 35th in classic sprint. **Lustgarten** recorded two NorAm U23 victories in classic distance racing at Rossland, B.C. **Lustgarten** and **Makayla Cappel** were the winners of 25k skate races at the West Yellowstone Rendezvous.

Mary Rose won a 10k freestyle at the U.S. Super Tour at Craftsbury, Vermont, and followed it up with a second-place performance in the 10k mass start classic.

U.S. and SVSEF Gold Team member **Tai Barrymore** turned in his best finish of the season, skiing to ninth overall in men's skier halfpipe at the Canadian Open in Calgary.



Beebe finished 12th overall in his first FIS Freeskiing Halfpipe World Championships in Kreischberg, Austria. He was 10th in the AFP World Tour Finals and finished the season ranked 24th in halfpipe.

ALPINE

Two SVSEF skiers picked up three wins in FIS racing at Mt. Bachelor, Oregon. In the Western Region Speed Series, **Kyla Miller** finished her season with a pair of victories in downhill. **Tanner Farrow** won one of the men's super G's and was runner-up in downhill.

17-year-old **Haley Cutler** won the opening super G in the Western Region Spring Series at Sun Valley.

Based on their stellar results at the Western Region Junior Alpine Championships at Mammoth Mountain, California, SVSEF racers **Kyla Miller** and **Duncan Fuller**, along with teammate **Haley Cutler**, earned the right to compete in the 2015 U.S. Alpine Championships at Sugarloaf, Maine.

Hometown racers **Haley Cutler** and **Jay Fitzgerald** will have their names engraved on the Laura Flood

Memorial trophy as the overall champions of the Intermountain Division Qualifying races staged in Sun Valley over the weekend.

SVSEF men put six racers in the top 10 and 13 in the top 30 with **Kristian DeWolfe** and **Yuri McClure** going one-two and **Jay Fitzgerald** fifth overall in the Intermountain Open at Jackson Hole. **Cooper Dart** was the fastest U16 racer and sixth overall. **Duncan Fuller** wore the winner's mantle on Friday. **Jay Fitzgerald** was third.

SVSEF's **Spencer Wright** proved to be a formidable opponent in speed events, winning seven super G titles and one downhill throughout the season. **Wright**, **Sebastian Mastor** and **Hayden Terjeson** swept the podium twice in the U16 division at the Trudi Bolinder Memorial super giant slaloms. **Skylar Cooley** skied to second, third and fourth. **Sage Rheinschild** was third.

Spencer Wright bagged the skiing equivalent of a hat trick, winning all three men's open class races at the Wes Barron Speed Series. Teammate **Hayden Terjeson** was runner-up twice. **Sage Rheinschild** was runner-up in the women's super G. **Alli Rathfon** won the U14 race with the second-fastest time for boys and girls.

Lily Fitzgerald stepped up on the podium twice at the U16 National Championships at Sugarloaf, Maine. Also in attendance at U16 Nationals were **Katelyn Rathfon**, **Matt O'Connor**, **Charlie Lamb**, **Hayden Terjeson** and **Spencer Wright**.

In U14 Intermountain Cup racing at Park City, **Bennett Snyder** claimed first and second. **Lily Fitzgerald** was a two-time silver medalist.

Hobson Memorial overall titles went to **Libby Kaiser** and **Ryder Sarchett**. Class champions were **Paige DeHart**, **Zephyr Carruth**, **Jessica Blackburn**, **Falon Hanna**, **Bennett Snyder**, **Ian Hanna** and **Wyatt Smith**.

BIATHLON

Former SVSEF cross country team member **Max Durtschi** was nominated to the U.S. Biathlon Team. Durtschi, 23, was a member of SVSEF Cross Country program for eight years, but started out his 10-year SVSEF tenure as a member of the snowboard team starting in 2003.

SVSEF alum **Sloan Storey** was the top American placing fifth twice in the final cross-country ski events at the 2015 NCAA Nordic Ski Championships. The two NCAA results represented the fourth and fifth All-American honors in three years for Storey, a junior at the University of Utah.

FREESKIING






Operating Revenue



Operating Expenses


