### LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

VSEF's 2016-17 season was another terrific year for SVSEF and our athletes. We had record levels of participation across all sports, but particularly in our entry-level learn-to-ski and development programs.

We were proud to help our athletes achieve great successes along with personal growth and development. SVSEF had a record number of athletes in all disciplines qualify for and achieve podium results in regional and national competitions. Through your generosity we've been able to keep these very expensive athletic endeavors a bit more affordable for our local youth. With over 20 percent of Blaine County students participating in SVSEF, we were able to subsidize the cost of programming by approximately \$1.3 million during the season AND provided an additional \$285,000 in need-based financial and merit aid. The success of our graduating class demonstrates our mission to develop strong personal character. Every senior athlete plans to either take a gap year to train and compete or will be attending a four-year college program, with about half planning to continue competing in college.

The quality of our coaching, programs, and processes was validated by receiving Gold Certification this spring from U.S. Ski and Snowboard, the highest designation awarded to the top five percent of the 360 member clubs across the country. In addition to achieving Gold Certification, other significant program enhancements included:

- » Completion and installation of a Nordic treadmill facility and rollerski paths.
- » Successful joint fundraising with Community School for new Residence Hall and a state of the art athletic training facility, open to all high school-aged SVSEF athletes and coaches.
- » Hosting high-caliber competitive events, including U.S. Freestyle Junior Nationals, Intermountain Division cross country Junior National qualifiers, and a top-level college and FIS alpine race series in March.



» Providing fresh web content along with consistent and regular communications for our various SVSEF constituents.

As we move into the 2017-18 season, we have the following initiatives:

- » Assume operational control of Rotarun and expand our learn-to-ski programs, particularly with first generation skiers.
- » Work with Blaine County Recreation District to move and secure for the long term our South Valley programming in Quigley Canyon.
- » Expand professional development for our coaching staff to incorporate positive coaching techniques and anti-bullying initiatives.
- » Revise and redefine programming around the park and pipe and mogul teams.
- Add an International Freeskiers and Snowboarders Association (IFSA) Big Mountain program offering.
- » Make improvements to the online tuition and travel registration process.
- » Expand our summer programs and camps, and make them available to anyone wishing to participate.

On behalf of our staff, coaches, volunteers and athletes, thank you so very much for your confidence in and support of our organization. Your investment in SVSEF helps pave the way for our athletes to succeed on the hills and trails, but equally important, prepare them to confront the challenges and seize the opportunities that lay ahead of them.

Everyone's path is different, but there is one defining characteristic: the challenge is very real, whether you are just getting going with the sport, or you are knocking on the door of greatness.



a discussion with Program Director Scott McGrew

*Why is your specific sport unique and/or important, and* how does it make a difference in the lives of your athletes?

Our training environment is defined by its dynamic nature. There are countless variables that shape the daily experience for the athletes. The wind, the snow, the training hill, and the course sets all present an orchestration of variables that demand total focus from our athletes. I have always believed that it is at the edge of our comfort zone that we learn best. Our athletes are asked to push themselves into a place outside of comfort every day they click into their skis. It takes courage, vision, competency, and a nimble mind to navigate the environment; not only to be safe, but to aspire to greatness. Learning to be comfortable with the uncomfortable is a timeless lesson that transcends the athletic elements of the pursuit. This is the magic that defines an alpine athlete, both in and out of the mountains.

What are the challenges inherent in your sport for athletes, parents, coaches? How has SVSEF helped to address them?

There are a number of significant challenges inherent in our sport. There is, naturally, the physical demand that high-level skiing requires. The comprehensive dryland training and the volume-driven athletic programming is designed to address that element. Of course, the physical aspect is the simplest to address. It is, at face value, what we do. The biggest challenge we face, as both an organization and as participants in winter sport, is what happens behind the curtain. Working to deliver an exceptional and inspired experience day in and day out requires a number of variables: a plan, a capable and professional staff, and the appropriate venues. Each of these elements requires time, resources, vision, and a culture that inspires engagement. We work extremely hard to deliver on all these fronts, while trying to keep the costs in check. Investment from our broader community, in the form of financial support, partnerships, and goodwill are core to the continued success of our organization. Through our reputation as a great club, the generosity of our donor base, and the allocation of financial aid, we have been able to strike a critical balance between our high expectations and sustainability.

#### SEASON STANDOUTS

This year presented one of the most successful years on record for the SVSEF alpine team. From our FIS team posting no less than 19 victories, to the USSA Team winning every single Intermountain Division qualifying event of the season (both boys and girls), there was no shortage of podium time for Sun Valley alpine skiers. From divisional events to National Championships, we

had an amazing amount of representation at all levels in the top tier. This is the results of countless hours of practice, program design, and sweat equity. The results this past year is something we can all be proud of; however, our greatest achievement continues to be the work that happens after an athlete's time with our team. This past season we successfully supported or matriculate six athletes into the NCAA skiing ranks. This is a tremendous feat for a small community, and is a true testimony to our commitment to both athletic and academic excellence.

One of the most amazing experiences we have, as an organization, is bearing witness to our graduating seniors. We have had the privilege, in many cases, to have watched these fine young individuals grow and mature into powerful, capable, and engaged human beings from the time they were seven and eight years old. The SVSEF experience is so much more than skiing; it represents a transformational journey for so many of our athletes (and parents!). We take great pride as the stewards of this journey for our athletes, and it is a bittersweet moment to say goodbye to athletes with whom we have spent so much time. This past year we graduated 13 amazing young people into the world. Of those 13, five will remain as postgraduates to continue their athletic journey, while eight of our seniors are incredibly positioned to make their mark as they continue their education. We are proud of these individuals who represent the very best of who we are as a community, and the power this experience has on shaping young lives.

Why is your specific sport unique and/or important, an how does it make a difference in the lives of your athlet



*Why is your specific sport unique and/or important, and* with new custom padding on the trampoline deck and how does it make a difference in the lives of your athletes? replaced the foam pit with a state-of-the-art air bag from bag jump.

The mogul program is a unique sport because it is not only athletes racing against the clock; they're also judged on turns, air and line. Our training is based around setting up specific goals in each of these elements of the sport. Not only are our athletes training to become stronger mogul skiers, they are also working on an aerial/gymnastic element over the course of the summer and winter.

What are the challenges inherent in your sport for athletes, parents, coaches? How has SVSEF helped to address them?

Last year, senior Brody Buchwalter returned after taking one and a half years off from competition. We spent countless hours in the Air Barn focusing on relearning Keeping athletes safe is always our number one priority. aerial maneuvers. Brody achieved his season goal of This year, SVSEF made improvements in the Air Barn qualifying for Junior Nationals and U.S. Senior Nationals.



All of our full-time travel coaches went to the Center of Excellence in Park City and received their level 200 aerials and level 200 mogul certifications. We also have a level 300 coach on staff, so athletes can get their jumps certified on snow at home for no additional cost.

Any anecdotes about athletes who stood out or overcame a challenge?

He started off the year ranked 199 and finished 53<sup>rd</sup> in the U.S.

*What sets your program apart from other programs* across the country? Anything specific this season?

Having the Air Barn makes this program unique. We are the only team in the country that has access to an indoor dry-slope ramp for aerial training year round. This allows athletes to develop the ability to train new tricks into an Air Bag then take it to the snow within the same day. We're also the only ski team with an air bag trampoline pit.

What were the goals of the program this season? How were they met? Who helped you meet them?

The mogul team had goals of qualifying a large group to Junior Nationals. The number was not specific, but we feel this was accomplished with 12 athletes qualifying for Junior Nationals and 11 athletes making the cut for

U.S. Senior National Championships. The coaching staff was a critical factor for achieving this goal.

What new programs or initiatives were added or taken on *this year? How did they turn out?* 

Last year we had a new head coach in John Grisby and the departure of our long-term Program Director Andy Ware. These were not initiatives, but set the tone of rebuilding within the program which has been a challenge to the organization.

### SEASON STANDOUTS

Holden Largay, 18, was new to our program this year from Montana. He started the year ranked 50<sup>th</sup> in the country and ended up 24<sup>th</sup>. He had a 4<sup>th</sup> at U.S. Junior Nationals and finished 13<sup>th</sup> at U.S. Senior Nationals.

Samantha Smith, 11, started the year off 54<sup>th</sup> in the country and ended the season ranked 33<sup>rd</sup>. She finished 2<sup>nd</sup> in her age group at U.S. Junior Nationals, which qualified her for the USSA Young Guns camp. She also had a 1<sup>st</sup> place overall at the Deer Valley Intermountain Freestyle event in February.

Luke Rizzo, 16, finished 12<sup>th</sup> at U.S. Junior Nationals and 20<sup>th</sup> at U.S. Senior National Championships. Luke really upped his game this year by learning a cork 1080. He won Most Inspirational Athlete of the Year for the team, which was awarded at our annual banquet.

*Why is your specific sport unique and/or important, and* how does it make a difference in the lives of your athletes

Park and pipe (freeski/snowboard) is a sport and an art; you are able to compete and express yourself on the hill. The challenge is to figure out how to ski and ride with elegance and grace while preforming tricks. It's not always about the hardest trick - it's more about how it looks. Slopestyle and halfpipe are judged sports with a lot of room for interpretation. Progression and style always have a roll in a judge's score. Style is not how you dress or what brand you are riding or skiing; it is how you move or flow down the terrain. Most everyone can dance or draw, but what stands out? The best styles. The best thing about freeskiing and riding is that all of the kids can express themselves creatively, and will be skiers or riders for life.

# PARK & PIPE



#### a discussion with Program Manager Tyler Conway

1	What are the challenges inherent in your sport for
s?	athletes, parents and coaches? How has SVSEF helped to
	address them?

- The biggest challenges with park and pipe are that you're not always sliding or riding down the terrain in one direction. Just think about all the hard work an alpine athlete puts into going downhill facing forward. Freeski and snowboard athletes have to master all movements on their skis and snowboards - backwards, sideways, buttering, nose press, tail press, nollie, ollie,
- Tokyo drift, the list goes on. On top of that, they have to add in air awareness with corks, spins and flips.
- At SVSEF, the Air Barn is a critical asset in development of air awareness. Sun Valley resort also provides our athletes with a fantastic terrain park – the more time that is spent skiing and riding in the terrain park, the

better they become. Through our partnership with Sun Valley Company, we can target building bigger jump features earlier in the year next season, which will be a huge benefit to SVSEF athletes.

What sets your program apart from other programs across the country? Anything specific this season?

SVSEF has a core group of athletes that loves to shred the park together – this plays a big role in the progression of the sport. They help and support each other in training and at competitions; our team spirit and camaraderie sets us apart.

What were the goals of the program this season? How were they met? Who helped you meet them?

The goal for last season was to improve slopestyle and halfpipe core abilities. Most athletes met this goal through summer and in-season Air Barn training. This base core of abilities gave our coaching staff the time to develop a plan to execute on-snow training targeted to increase these abilities with our athletes. What new programs or initiatives were added or taken on this year? How did they turn out?

This season we combined freeski and snowboarding into one program working together. Travel and on-hill cross-coaching worked well, and will continue to be our plan moving forward. Competition and training camp travel will increase for the upcoming season throughout the park and pipe program.

# Anyone (parent, coach, athlete) stand out in helping make a successful season?

Coach Collin Collins has the natural ability to teach, and he was always on time with great knowledge of the sport. He knows how to explain tricks and gives positive and constructive feedback to the athletes. Collin is a role model to our athletes here at SVSEF.

We are grateful for all of the parents on the park and pipe teams. Without parents volunteering for our USSA, USASA, and Junior National events, we could not have delivered smooth and successful events.




#### SEASON STANDOUTS
