

The 2024/25 season was a strong one for SVSEF Cross Country, with nearly 215 athletes ages 5 to 30 training, racing, growing and learning across every level of the program—from Striders to the Gold Team.

Our youngest skiers developed confidence and ski skills through fun focused sessions of chocolate laps and adventure skis, while Prep and Comp Team athletes showed tremendous progress in technique and racing and yes—the troll ski is still a fan favorite! Highlights included top finishes at Intermountain Youth Champs, Junior Nationals qualifications, and awesome team/individual results at IMD JNQ's, local and regional events with a team win at the Western Club Championships.

Post-Grad and Gold Team athletes delivered incredible performances at U.S. Nationals and World Cup and Para World Cup competitions, earning national podiums and Para World Championship titles with an impressive number of World Cup starts. Their commitment to excellence and mentorship continues to inspire the entire SVSEF community.

From first-time striders to seasoned World Cup athletes, SVSEF XC remains committed to fostering community through lessons of resilience, sportsmanship, mentorship, culture building, and the shared joy and love of skiing. SVSEF XC is more than a ski team; it's a lifelong journey, a community, and a place where every skier—from their first stride to the World Cup finish line—has a home.

We have the support of an amazing local snowboard community and the broader Wood River Valley, and the passion on display at our home events and celebrations show that indeed, "The Kids Are Alright!"

KEY ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Established the South Valley Devo Program to help create a bridge from South Valley learn-to-ride programs to the larger SVSEF Snowboard Program and teams. The initial goal was 5 riders, we registered 12 and expect further growth.
- SVSEF Snowboarding shared training venues right in our own backyard with the U.S. Snowboard Team at Soldier Mountain. Training amongst top level athletes and working different terrain features very early in the season helped set the table for some major progression from our riders.
- Riders continue to move through the SVSEF Snowboard pipeline, which has been taking shape with the team's re-structure over the last four years.
- Two SVSEF riders were named USASA Big Mountain West Series Champions: Naomi Gorringer (SS/HP/BX) Camille Armeen (BX)
- Seven riders attended USASA National Championships at Copper Mountain, CO, where the team had multiple top 10 results in three different disciplines.
- The team made key hires with Dave Boldwin taking the helm of all Devo programming and Edward Sawicz (Alum) stepping into a Head Travel Coach role. These moves have helped us continue to grow and support our athletes across the board.
- Hosted the Beverly Hay Snowboard Cup events at Dollar Mountain—a tradition since 1999.

FUN FACT

- On July 30, 2024, the statue of Olympic Halfpipe Gold Medalist Kaitlyn Farrington was unveiled at Champions Meadow in Sun Valley. An inspiring reminder of what's possible for our athletes as they make their way to training sessions at Dollar Mountain.

KEY ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- FIS Women had a breakout season with 7 wins and 26 podiums.
- Haley Cutler (SVSEF Alum) earned her first World Cup point and earned a spot to compete on the 2025/26 World Cup Tour in both Super G and Downhill.
- Tucker Reimund was selected for Burke NPS Project for U16's and qualified as one of six USA athletes to compete in the Cimbra FIS Children's Cup featuring 800 of the top U16 and U14 athletes around the world.
- Conway Selznick brought home the 2025 Bryce Astle IMC Overall title.
- 874 SVSEF Alpine volunteers worked a total of 5,763 hours to support Sun Valley in bringing back the highest level of ski racing to our community and region—the 2025 Audi FIS World Cup Finals.

SVSEF Freeski believes every athlete is the captain of their own ship. Progress looks different for each individual—whether it's landing a first trick, stepping onto a podium, or simply learning to get back up after a fall. Success here isn't just measured by results but by resilience, confidence, and personal growth.

This year, the team packed in a variety of unique experiences that pushed athletes in both skill and adventure. We kicked things off with international training and competition, skiing The Remarkables in New Zealand and participating in the NZ Open. Athletes traveled to Austria for early-season momentum at the Zoo Terrain Park on the Stubai Glacier and flew through the air at Banger Park's airbag facility. A highlight for many was training on the U.S. Freeski Team jumps at Soldier Mountain. Back home, countless hot laps at Dollar Mountain helped sharpen rail and jump skills in a fun, fast-paced environment.

Our coaches focused on intentional skill development, goal setting, and mental performance. SVSEF's mission lives in every athlete's journey—from first rail slides to Rev Tour starts. Special shoutout to Zeppelin Pilaro for winning the Futures Tour Slopestyle at Mammoth!






Freeskiing in the terrain parks, practicing tricks on the trampolines and parkour features in the Air Barn, freestyle skiing in the bumps and jumps, big mountain line selection, exploring all the terrain Baldy and Dollar have to offer, and mountain awareness are what this program was built on.

Intramural competitions in the disciplines of Freestyle (moguls), Freeski (park and pipe) and Freeride (Big Mountain), along with others like old school Hotdoggers, Mini SLVSH cups, Mini Big Airs, NASTAR, and off-piste Chinese Downhill races continue to challenge and inspire the Mini Xers!

As with anything, if you stick with it for long enough, you will have your day. Mini X athletes are encouraged with freedom and creativity to explore the mountains on skis and discover their own unique style that will be their superpower if and when they choose to specialize in the area of skiing that most suits their style.

- At the Mineshaft Freeski Competition, style and mastery of switch tricks, boxes, and rails earned Nolan Garza and Josie Dondero dimes in our annual Freeski comp.



Affordable and tuition-free programming helps set an industry example for what is possible and brings our community closer together through the sports we love and the mountains we play in.

Through SVSEF's integral support of the Rota-Rippers afterschool program, more than 100 kids are given the opportunity each season to learn and train on snow two days a week after school. They embrace tradition, build friendships, and create lifelong memories with their families at a magical place called Rotarun.

For more than 75 years, this little hill rising just over 400 vertical feet has been the starting line of big dreams for so many—and since 2017, the Rota-Rippers have inspired and enriched the lives of nearly 1,000 historically marginalized youth in our community. Rotarun's mission will always be to provide affordable access to locals and new generations of skiers and riders, and SVSEF remains a steadfast partner in this essential work.

The 2024/25 season was one of defining success for the SVSEF Freestyle Team. This season saw numerous regional podiums as well as six overall podiums at Intermountain Divisional Championships.
